One of the greatest challenges of our time remains how to make security - pursue freedom from threats in an anarchic international system. The concept of security, however, has been enormously multifaceted and has been defined differently by different schools of thought. In particular, it has been revisited and contested in the context of many new security challenges, risks and threats that are associated with growing complexity of post-Cold War international political order.

Sino-Nordic Security Research Workshop aims at promoting cutting-edge research on international security by bringing together Chinese and Nordic expertise. This workshop will give an overview of the state of the art of security research and address key agendas that future theories should tackle. We encourage theory-informed analysis on the perennial security problems as well as particular security challenges facing Europe and Asia.

This one-and-a-half day workshop features keynote lecture and paper presentations. The workshop will be the official launch of a series of research cooperation in political science discipline that Fudan and UCPH have planed to develop in the coming years. It also serves as a program celebrating the 20th Anniversary of Fudan Nordic Center.

Chen Zhimin (Fudan)

CHEN Zhimin is the Dean of the School of International Relations and Public Affairs, Fudan University, Shanghai, China. He is a professor of international relations and a Jean Monnet Chair of European foreign policy. He is vice president of Chinese Association of International Studies. He was a visiting fellow at Harvard University (1996-1997), also visiting scholar at Queen's University, University of Durham, Lund University, Sciences Po. and Keio University. His research interests include international relations theory, diplomacy studies, Chinese foreign policy and EU studies.

Lars Bo Kaspersen (UCPH)

Lars Bo Kaspersen is Professor of Political Sociology and Head of the Department of Political Science, University of Copenhagen. Professor Kaspersen studied history, politics, and sociology at University of Copenhagen, University of Sussex, Birkbeck College, London, UC Santa Barbara and University of Aarhus.

Wu Xinbo (Fudan)

WU Xinbo is Professor and Executive Dean, Institute of International Studies, and Director at the Center for American Studies, Fudan University. He teaches and researches China's foreign and security policy, Sino-U.S. relations, and U.S. Asia-Pacific policy. In 1994, he spent one year at the George Washington University as a visiting scholar. In the fall of 1997, he was a visiting fellow at the Asia-Pacific Research Center, Stanford University and the Henry Stimson Center in Washington DC. From January to August, 2000, he was a Visiting Fellow at the Brookings Institution. From September 2006 to July 2007, he was a Jennings Randolph Senior Fellow at the United States Institute of Peace.

Chen Yinzhang (FNC)

CHEN Yinzhang is professor and director of Fudan Nordic Centre. He is special advisor to the President of Fudan University. He also serves as Secretary-General of Shanghai Forum and Fudan Development Institute (FDDI).

Geir Helgesen (Nias/UCPH)

Geir Helgesen is Director of Nias –Nordic Institute of Asian Studies, director of Fudan-European Centre for China Studies. He is a cultural sociologist and works on political culture in Asia, and Korean affairs.

Pan Zhongqi (Fudan)

PAN Zhongqi is Professor of International Relations at the School of International Relations and Public Affairs, Fudan University. His focus of research includes

international relations theory, China and international system, China's foreign policy and strategy, China-US and China-EU relations, etc. He was seconded by China's Foreign Ministry as a First Secretary at Mission of the People's Republic of China to the European Communities in 2008-9. He was a research fellow at the Shanghai Institute for International Studies in 2000-2005. He was a Fulbright Visiting Research Scholar to University of California, San Diego (2012-13), visiting scholar to Lund University (2006), the Fairbank Center at Harvard University (2004), the Henry Stimson Center (2001), and University of Tokyo (1999-2000). Liu Chunrong (Fudan)

LIU Chunrong is Associate Professor of Political Science at School of International Relations and Public Affairs of Fudan University. He serves as the Executive Vice Director of Fudan-European Center for China Studies at University of Copenhagen. Dr. Liu's main teaching and research interests lie in the fields of comparative politics, political sociology and Chinese politics. He has been interested in developing and using sociological views of how public institutions emerge, remain stable, and are transformed to study the Chinese local state and social organization in the post-reform era. Sponsored by China National Social Science Foundation and Shanghai Humanity and Social Science Foundation, he has published widely on local state and grassroots organizing in China.
